Student Drop off & Pick up

For the safety of students and staff we have set drop off and pick up procedures. AM Drop off – Between the times of 7:30 and 7:50, Jr/Sr High Students will need to be dropped off in parking lot, away from car rider line, and walk across the lot. No students are to be dropped off at the entrances of the school during this time due to the elementary car rider line.

If students arrive at school after 7:55 a.m.,



THE ANGEL FUNDS PROGRAM





Some children may receive breakfast and lunch at no cost if they are eligible for free and reduced meals based on federal poverty guidelines. Sometimes, however, children who do not qualify for such programing may lack money in their cafeteria accounts. Meals are never denied to students, but the unpaid meal charges present a difficult and stressful issue for the students we serve.





NAFCS "Weather Day" Guidance

NAFCS Families,

11/15/2024

I wanted to reach out with some information as the winter weather season is upon us. This year we will be utilizing and/or operating under two different "snow day" scenarios if severe winter weather impacts school. The weather event and situation will determine which type of Snow Day our school district will be implementing: We will either use a <u>Traditional Snow Day</u> or an <u>Asynchronous Snow Day</u>.

If there is a chance of severe winter weather that could impact school, NAFCS administration will communicate with teachers and direct them to send devices and chargers home with students. If school is canceled, families will receive an all-call from the corporation where we will alert families how we will be operating that particular day.

Below are the instructional guidelines for each day.

1. Traditional Snow Day - Make-Up Day

- There is a possibility, depending on the intensity and number of weather events, that we would make up the school days at a later time.
- The Traditional Snow Days could be made up during the Spring Break Snow Make-Up/
 Intersession Week (Our plan is to use the following days as Make Up Days March 17, 18,
 19; and then days following the end of the scheduled school year). We would use 3
 traditional make up days in March before we would use any more Asynchronous Days.

2. Asynchronous Snow Day - Posting of Assignments

- Teachers will post information about the day's learning and assignments via our Learning Management System (Google Classroom, textbook, etc) by 9:00 am.
- Teachers will hold office hours and be available for questions and communication with students and parents from 9:00 am - 2:00 pm.
- Communication received from students/parents between 9:00 am and 2:00 pm will be returned the same day.
- Students will be provided (3) three school days to complete all posted assignments and tasks upon return to school. Students without internet access may turn in their completed work for evidence of attendance.
- Reminder for k-4 students: All Chromebooks and charging cords must be returned to school on the next in person school day. These are signed out per individual student each day they go home. Thank you for your support, help and care with these items as we work to provide the best resources possible for our students.

NAFCS Administration puts our students, families and team members' safety first when making decisions on school closures and/or delays. When those decisions are made, we will do our best to get that information disseminated as quickly and efficiently as possible so that families can make informed decisions and proper arrangements.
